

An Elevator Speech. You are travelling in a lift and you have one minute in which to tell your travelling companion what Simpol is all about. You have to learn it by heart.

Simpol in Brief.

Simpol is short for Simultaneous Policy – or SP, as it is known.

Simultaneous Policy measures are designed to be implemented by multiple national governments at exactly the same time. In this way, no one nation is put at a competitive disadvantage against the others.

These harmonised policies can relate to climate change, resource sharing, arms reduction, controls over multinational corporations and any of the many other areas in which no single government can go it alone without getting clobbered by competitors.

Simpol is the name of the international political movement working to develop these cooperative, non-competitive, policies and to have them implemented.

Under the Simpol system, you are asked to vote for candidates who pledge to implement Simultaneous Policy measures if they are elected. In the UK, after only one General Election, there are already 20 Members of the House of Commons, drawn from all parties, pledged to implement Simultaneous Policy.

Small numbers of swing voters, who have adopted the Simpol voting system, can exert huge leverage on election results.

If you want your vote to really make a difference to the way the world is governed, adopt SP.
